

# SOILLE SAN DIEGO HEBREW DAY SCHOOL



## FINANCIAL AID

Soille Hebrew Day School believes that the community is stronger when it is comprised of students from varying socio-economic backgrounds who benefit from and contribute to the campus experience. Soille Hebrew Day remains committed to ensure that a Jewish education remains accessible to students regardless of their economic circumstances. Soille San Diego Hebrew Day School offers financial aid grants for Kindergarten through Eighth grade to qualifying families. Financial aid is not available for the preschool.

Soille Hebrew Day's tuition assistance is **strictly need-based**. Because we believe that funding an independent school education should be given high priority, all families are expected to make a meaningful contribution to the tuition. The tuition assistance committee is comprised of Board members and volunteer men and women whose goal is to most fairly allocate available financial aid funds.

### **Applying For Financial Aid**

In order for a student's application for tuition assistance to be considered, all forms and documents that are referred to in the tuition assistance application must be submitted to the business office by **the deadline of February 29, 2008**, or as soon as possible in the case of a late application.

Soille Hebrew Day cannot guarantee any level of financial support beyond any single year and that the Tuition Assistance Committee reviews each tuition assistance award annually. Adjustment to an award can occur because of a change in a family's financial situation and/or adjustments to or changes in the school's financial aid guidelines.

It is the responsibility of parents to finance their child's education insofar as they are able. However, not everyone family can afford independent school tuition and fees. Since dollars are limited, the school makes a concerted effort to responsibly evaluate each request for aid. As part of the evaluation, Soille Hebrew Day, like most independent schools, utilizes the services of the National Private School Act Service for Financial Aid, or PSAS. Based up a written application, PSAS assesses a family's resources to determine how much that family can afford to pay in tuition and fees. Using this report and other available information, the **Tuition Assistance Committee** renders a decision as to an appropriate scholarship grant

The deadline for applying for assistance is February 29, 2008. Recipients will be notified after April 11, 2008. For more information please contact the Business Manager at (858) 279-3300 ext. 105. Late applications will be considered, but only if financial aid monies are available.
