



Positive COVID Case of a Staff Member or Student at Hebrew Day Protocol

The following is San Diego Hebrew Day's order of action when a positive case is reported by a staff member or student:

1. Notify the public health department
2. **Case while school is in session:** Isolate case and remove from school for 10 days of test date
3. **Case during a break or found during post-break testing:** Exclude person from school for 10 days of test date.
4. Identify contacts, quarantine and exclude exposed contacts (likely entire cohort) for 14 days after the last date the case was present at school while infectious
5. Recommend testing of contacts, prioritize symptomatic contacts (testing will not shorten 14 day quarantine)
6. Disinfection and cleaning of classroom and primary spaces where case spent significant time if case is during the time school was open.
7. School remains open (pending advisement from local public health department)

Additional Information:

All test results, negative or positive, will be reported to the school administration through the email testresults@ssdhds.org. Additional information or questions regarding testing or anything regarding COVID, can be directed to the school nurse, Bobbe Reitman at breitman@ssdhds.org.

In the event that a staff or student at SDHD tests positive with COVID, SDHD's School Nurse will be in immediate communication with the local public health department to determine the risk level within the specific community. Pending this risk level, the school will be prepared for a partial or full closure of the school on the same day. The School Nurse and COVID-19 Coordinator, with the support of school administrators, will conduct a thorough investigation to identify any close contacts at school or in the school community. They will also work to identify areas within the facility that may have been exposed and will need to be closed for cleaning and disinfection.

Additionally, the school has prepared communication that will be sent out immediately to students, parents, employees and the school community in the event that a student, parent or staff member becomes ill with COVID-19 or there is a partial or full school closure.

The criteria for full closure will be based on guidance from the CDPH and San Diego County

Department of Health and Human Services.
